Ice Cream Cone Creations

An Art Lesson for Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd Grade (Week of May 25th).



What could be better for dessert than an ice cream cone? With all the different ice cream flavors available and unlimited toppings, there is no end to how you can build your perfect sweet treat. Sometimes, artists like to use their love of ice cream, and other desserts, as the subject matter for their works of art. Take a look at some examples below and try not to lick your computer screen!









You will be creating your own ice cream cone artwork.

Materials:

A variety of different colored pieces of construction paper, glue, scissors, compass or objects to trace to form circles, colored markers, ruler, pencil, holepunch.


Follow the steps below:



Gather all your materials.



Arrange and glue your shapes.



Trace and cut out 1 triangle and 3 circles. Use a ruler and compass (or rounded objects).



Add lots of detail with marker and small cut paper shapes.

Things to think about:

- Draw the triangle and three circles with a pencil.
- Cut carefully on top of all lines.
- Arrange and glue the cone first, then overlap (one a little bit on top of the other) the three circles for the ice cream scoops.
- Decide on all the details you will add to your ice cream cone. Maybe chocolate chips, sprinkles, cherries, whipped cream, nuts, gummy worms, etc. ...
- A real cone has diagonal lines on the outside. Use your ruler to equally space criss crossing lines when drawing them on your cone shape.
- Use your leftover paper scraps to make a patterned border of shapes around all four edges of your artwork.
